

Mt. Sengan

Nationally designated as **【Height:162 m】**
Cultural Property & Scenic Beauty

**To be full of the joys of spring,
Mt. Sengan is a famous place for cherry blossoms.**

Mt. Sengan was named for its scenery of oddly shaped rocks. This mountain used to be called “Mt. *Tejakushi*”(literally, “pour your own drink”) after a legend that *Amakusa Shiro*, the leader of the *Shimabara Amakusa Revolt*(1637), drank sake in advance with his followers before they left for the battle.

The lookout on the top of Mt. Sengan, offers a magnificent panoramic view of the Amakusa Go-kyo (Amakusa’s Five Bridges) which connects the islands, as well as the Uto Peninsula, Shimabara Peninsula, Amakusa Shimoshima, and the Yatsushiro Sea.
